



Carren Willard Joye is the author of the award-winning *Homeschooling More Than One Child: A Practical Guide for Families* as well as *A Stay-at-Home Mom's Complete Guide to Playgroups* and an Internet-linked *Alabama State History Curriculum*

. A homeschooling mom of four children, Carren has founded four successful playgroups, a regional homeschool support group, a homeschool co-op, and a statewide homeschool covering.

Playgroups

Carren started her first playgroup in Montgomery in the spring of 1994. Six months later her family moved to a nearby small town, Millbrook, so in January 1995 she started a second playgroup in her new hometown. She continued leading the Millbrook Area Playgroup until her fourth child turned four years old nine years later in 2004. During those nine years, Carren also started a playgroup for preschool boys and their moms and assisted countless playgroups around the world via her web site, OnlinePlaygroup.com.



Her first book, *A Stay-at-Home Mom's Complete Guide to Playgroups* (ISBN 0-595-14684-8), was published by [iUniver
se.com](http://iUniverse.com)

in December 2000. To promote the book, Carren completed a successful booksigning in Montgomery, Alabama, in June 2001.

Homeschool

In the summer of 1994, Carren and her husband began homeschooling their four-year-old daughter while their one-year-old was still in diapers. What started as a one-year experiment has turned into a lifestyle of many years. Currently, they homeschool all four children from elementary through high school, and that little four-year-old and one-year-old have now graduated from homeschool and attend university.

Through the years, Carren has contributed her support and expertise in the homeschooling

community. In April 2000, Carren and a fellow homeschooling mom co-founded a regional homeschool support group, [Elmore County Homeschool Organization \(ECHO\)](#). Shortly afterwards, she and her husband founded a statewide homeschool covering,

[Outlook Academy](#)

, which she still directs. In fall 2006, Carren and two homeschooling moms started a homeschool co-op for area families, called

[Academy Days](#)

. In her capacity as leader of ECHO and administrator of Outlook Academy and the Academy Days co-op, she has helped many homeschooling families in Alabama.



Her second book, *Homeschooling More Than One Child: A Practical Guide for Families*, was published in March 2005 by

[iUniverse.com](#)

. In addition to rave reviews from such homeschooling magazines as *The Old Schoolhouse*

, it won first place in the reference category of the 13th Annual *Writer's Digest*

International Self-Published Book Awards and was featured in the March 2006 issue of *Writer's Digest*

along with the winners in eight other categories. A few months later, her book won First Runner Up in the home category of the 2006 Writers Notes Book Awards.



Carren has also written an Internet-linked *Alabama State History Curriculum* that is available on this site for \$29. Her family first used this curriculum during the 2004-05 school year, and both a private school and the

[Academy Days](#)

homeschool co-op used the curriculum in 2007-08. The links are updated each year.

Carren has been interviewed on homeschool issues for several magazines, newspapers and radio programs. She was the featured guest the week of June 2-6, 2008, on [Home School Heartbeat](#), an

informative two-minute daily radio program produced by Home School Legal Defense Association (HSLDA). During the five-day program, she shared tips on homeschooling multiple children.
